



Camp Rules

Violation of these rules can result in a time-out, loss of privileges, or possible expulsion from camp, depending on the seriousness of the offense.

1. Campers are expected to participate in all camp events and activities. Sleeping cabins will remain off-limits, except for scheduled or announced times. Campers may not enter the sleeping cabin areas unless at least one adult staff member is present.
2. Enjoy camp, but not at the expense of others.
3. Cooperation and respect should be shown to staff, adult volunteers, instructors, and county faculty at all times.
4. Possession of firearms, fireworks, weapons (including pocket knives), alcohol, tobacco, or narcotics is prohibited and grounds for immediate dismissal. If there is reason to believe a person has an illegal item or substance in their possession, staff has the right to inspect or search the camper's possessions in his/her presence.
5. Campers must observe the established hours for curfew; camp quiet hours are lights out-7:00 am. Camp is a time for fun, but it is also a time to keep good health habits. Quiet after "Lights Out" is necessary so each camper may keep well and enjoy every minute of camp. Beds should not be pushed together in order to comply with this rule. Avoid being among the chosen few noted for public speaking after "Lights Out."
6. Campers are not permitted to leave their cabins between lights out and 7:00 am except in the case of an emergency (such as fire or illness).
7. Campers are expected to dress modestly and appropriately for camp activities; do not pack clothing with pro-drug and alcohol messages, scanty clothing (including halter tops, tube tops, and short shorts), clothing with vulgar or profane messages or gang apparel.
8. Wear shoes at all times!
9. Campers are required to maintain their personal belongings in an orderly manner and respect other camper's property. Other people's property is personal and off limits to everyone but the owner. Campers should not bring valuables to camp including **walkmans, cell phones, beepers, walkie talkies, and stereos**. The camp will not be responsible for any articles that are lost or stolen.
10. Campers will be charged for damages, alterations, or removals that they cause to the camp property.
11. Keep cabin orderly and pleasant. Having food is a privilege and will be taken away if abused, i.e. improper disposal of waste.
12. Keep grounds clean. Put food and bottles in the trash.
13. No visitors allowed on campus except in emergency situations. Unidentified individuals should be reported to an adult staff member. Likewise, campers are not permitted to leave camp property unless advanced arrangements are made with the staff in charge.
14. No boys are allowed in the girls' cabin area and no girls are permitted in the boys' cabin area (known at state camps as "no purpling").
